### DAY 1 SUNDAY, DECEMBER 24 Departure

Depart the United States

### DAY 2 MONDAY, DECEMBER 25 Arrive in Israel

- Arrive in Israel to be met and assisted at Ben Gurion International Airport (Programming may begin earlier depending on arrival time).
- Transfer to hotel in Jerusalem and check in
- Israel After October 7th, Dinner and discussion with Haviv Rettig Gur, Political Correspondent and Senior Analyst at the Times of Israel at hotel.
- Overnight: Dan Panorama Hotel, Jerusalem

# DAY 3 TUESDAY, DECEMBER 26 The Western Negev

- Breakfast at the hotel.
- The Gaza Story, with Colonel Reserve Grisha Yaakubovitch, who served in the IDF Civil Administration in the Gaza region.
- Depart for the Western Negev and visit a Kibbutz, which was devastated Hamas' brutal October 7 attack, in conjunction with the IDF and residents. (pending approval and confirmation).
- Continue to Kibbutz Alumim, where a heroic defense by the kibbutz's emergency response team prevented held off Hamas terrorists, including hearing a first-hand account of the battle by a member of the Emergency Response Team.
- Packed lunch enroute.
- Visit Netivot A town at the entrance to the War Zone to visit a 'special kitchen' set up to serve thousands of soldiers serving in the region, with an opportunity to pack provisions for

soldiers and meet with local social workers.

#### OR

Continue to the town of Sderot, a symbol of Israel's longstanding conflict with Hamas, to drive through the town, stopping at its Police Station, which was demolished in order to rout terrorists who had taken over the building, followed by a meeting with Mayor Alon Davidi at City Hall.

- Travel to the **Jerusalem Corridor**.
- Visit evacuee families, together with Tali Levanon, Director of the Israel Trauma Coalition, at a hotel where they are being housed in the Jerusalem Corridor.
- Free evening, dinner on own.
- Overnight: Dan Panorama Hotel, Jerusalem

## DAY 4 WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 27 Tel Aviv

- Breakfast at hotel
- Visit the Hamal Hayerushalmi
  (Jerusalem Civil Society
  Coordination Center) on the campus
  of the Nissan Netiv Drama School,
  for a briefing with Adir Schwartz, a
  Jerusalem community leader and a
  founder of the center, followed by an
  opportunity to engage in hands-on
  volunteer work.
- · Drive to Tel Aviv.
- Continue to Ichilov Hospital to meet with medical staff and injured soldiers.
- Lunch on your own in Tel Aviv.
- Walk from Ichilov to the Tel Aviv Art Museum Plaza, now re-named Hostage Square, which is the focal point of the families' efforts to BRING THEM HOME.
- Conclude at the Hostages and Missing Families Forum Headquarters, the center of efforts to raise international awareness to plight of the hostages. The visit will include meetings with volunteer organizers, media specialists, therapists and family members of

hostages still in Gaza.

- · Return to Jerusalem
- Free evening with dinner on own.
- Overnight: Dan Panorama Hotel, Jerusalem

### DAY 5 THURSDAY, DECEMBER 28

- Breakfast at hotel and check out of hotel.
- Briefing on U.S.-Israel Relations by an AIPAC Israel representative at hotel.
- Guided tour of Israel's new National Library and see the Hostages Reading Circle.
- Travel to the Old City of Jerusalem.
- Discover the archaeological story of the Western Wall and episodes of Jewish life in Jerusalem 2,000 years ago at Robinson's Arch and the Southern Wall Excavations.
- Visit the traditional prayer area of the Western Wall.
- Lunch on own and free time in the Jewish Quarter.
- Concluding discussion, followed by farewell dinner at a local restaurant.
- Transfer to Ben Gurion International Airport for U.S. bound flight.
- Overnight: In Flight or midday flight depending on availability
