Friday, December 22 - Tel Aviv: The First Hebrew City in 2,000 Years

- Guided tour of Anu The Museum of the Jewish People on the campus of Tel Aviv University.
- Hear about the establishment of Tel Aviv standing at the Founders' Monument on Rothschild Boulevard. Then see the Bauhaus architecture for which central Tel Aviv was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- Lunch on your own and free time to explore the Nachalat Binyamin crafts fair. While there checkout the nearby Carmel Market and bohemian Sheinkin Street - All Three of these Tel Aviv icons meet at the "Magen David Junction".
- Free time to get ready for Shabbat.

Saturday, December 23 – And on the Seventh Day…in Tel Aviv

Sunday, December 24 – Cradles of Jewish Civilization

- Guided tour of the ornate Bahai
 Gardens in Haifa from the top of Mt.
 Carmel to the Bahai Shrine.

- Tour mystical Tzfat's old synagogues and picturesque alleyways. Tzfat was the cradle of Kabbalah (Jewish mysticism) in the 16th century. Judaism's Friday night service, Kabbalat Shabbat and the hymn Lecha Dodi originated in Tzfat at that time.
- Free time to browse in galleries and explore **Tzfat's Artists Colony** on own.
- Check-in to the **Ruth-Rimonim Hotel** in **Tzfat**.
- Dinner at hotel
- Overnight: Ruth-Rimonim Hotel, Tzfat

Monday, December 25 - Ancient and Modern Geopolitics and Israel's Finest

- Walk in the lush **Tel Dan Nature Reserve,** one of the sources of the **Jordan River,** where you'll discover biblical intrigue and one of the oldest arches in the world.
- Lunch on own.
- Jeep tour of the Golan Heights for a special perspective on Israel's complex geopolitics as we visit former Syrian bunkers overlooking Israel and then look out from the peak of strategic Mt. Bental.
- Chocolate making workshop at the De Karina Chocolate Factory on nearby Kibbutz Ein Zivan.
- BBQ dinner with young Israeli soldiers who are giving some of the best years of their lives to the defense of Israel.

Tuesday, December 26 – Across Israel: A Multicultural Jewish Society

- Discover Ethiopian Jewish culture at the Germachin Center in Beit Shean. Learn about this community's modern day Exodus story and the challenges facing the Ethiopian Israeli community today.
- Lunch on own.
- Continue south through the Jordan Valley and ascend to Jerusalem.
- Shehekhiyanu-Welcome Ceremony on Mt. Scopus overlooking the Old City of Jerusalem and Temple Mount.
- Enter the **Old City of Jerusalem** through the **Zion Gate**.
- Tour of the **Jewish Quarter** including the **Cardo**, **Broad Wall** and **Rooftops** followed by free time to shop and explore on your own.
- Check-in to the Dan Panorama Hotel in Jerusalem.
- Dinner on own.
- *Recommendation:* Visit the Israel Museum to see the Dead Sea Scrolls and the Model of ancient Jerusalem in the first century. Additional recommended exhibitions are Modern Israeli art, Synagogue

interiors in the Judaica Section and the **Archaeology Wing**.

Wednesday, December 27 – Masada and the Dead Sea: Freedom Fighters or Fanatics?

- Set out early ascend Masada by cable car to tour the ruins of King Herod's palace and the last outpost of Jewish independence. Discussion: Which Jewish Legacy – Masada or Yavne? Who were our ancesters? What decision did they make?
- Swim in the **Dead Sea**, the lowest place on earth, at a local resort. The resort also has a fresh water pool and spa facilities. Massage and spa treatments available by prior reservation at own expense.
- Lunch at Dead Sea resort (Herbert Samuel Hotel).
- Tour the ruins of **Qumran**, where the **Dead Sea Scrolls** were discovered to hear about the unique community that lived there (*Time permitting*).
- Return to Jerusalem
- Free evening. Dinner on own.
 Overnight: Dan Panorama Hotel, Jerusalem


Thursday, December 28 - The Old City of Jerusalem: An Ancient Jewish Legacy

- Discover the archaeological story of the Western Wall and episodes of Jewish life 2,000 years ago at Robinson's Arch and the Southern Wall Excavations. Hear about a new archaeological discovery connected to the Chanukah story.
- Discover underground Jerusalem in the **Western Wall Tunnels**.
- Lunch on own in the bustling Machane Yehuda Market to take in a slice of local life and Jewish flavors from east and west.
- Engage in hands on tzedakah preparing food packages for distribution to some of Israel's neediest people at Pantry Packers in southern Jerusalem.

Friday, December 29 - Holocaust, Remembrance and Continuity
